ALUMNI ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP FOR CONTINUING EDUCATION

CLOSING DATE: 4 DECEMBER 2009

To provide financial support to AUT Alumni (including those with qualifications from Auckland Institute of Technology, Auckland Technical Institute or Seddon Memorial Technical College) undertaking post-degree study at AUT University.

AMOUNT AND TYPE OF AWARD

- One scholarship is awarded on an annual basis
- The scholarship will cover the cost of full tuition fees (MBA excluded)
- The scholarship does not include the Students' Association fee
- Payment will be made direct to the Student through the Alumni Association.

TENURE

- The tenure is for one year.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- AUT Scholarship Application Form
- Academic Transcript
- Please provide a 500 word statement regarding your qualifications, professional/relevant experiences, and future career goals.

CRITERIA

- Applicants must be NZ citizens or permanent residents
- A scholarship may be awarded to any student who is a graduate of AUT University (or any of its predecessors) and is currently enrolled or seeking acceptance into a post-degree programme at AUT
- A scholarship is awarded for academic excellence, although professional experience and financial need will be taken into account.

SELECTION

- Applications are considered by the Alumni selection panel which comprises a senior member of AUT staff, the Alumni Association President and an Alumni Association Board member
- The panel may choose to interview one or more applicants and reserves the right to recommend that no award be made if there are no applicants of sufficient merit.

CONDITIONS OF ACCEPTANCE

- This scholarship may be held with any other bursary, prize or student allowance unless the conditions of the other funding precludes this option
- The award of the scholarship is contingent upon acceptance into a post-degree programme
- Scholarship recipients are eligible to reapply in any year following their receipt of the award.

VICE-CHANCELLOR'S DOCTORAL SCHOLARSHIPS

CLOSING DATE: 30 OCTOBER 2009

The purpose of the AUT Vice-Chancellor's Doctoral Scholarships is to encourage and stimulate doctoral studies in areas of University research capability.

AMOUNT AND TYPE OF AWARD

The scholarship covers the following:

- Annual payment of tuition and student services fees;
- The scholarship does not include the Students' Association fee;
- An annual stipend of \$25,000 per year.

TENURE

The scholarship is tenable for a period not exceeding three years.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

The following must be supplied to the Scholarships Office by the closing date:

- AUT VC Doctoral Scholarship Application Form;
- Academic Transcript(s);
- Two academic referees who will testify in writing directly and confidentially to the Scholarships Office, on the applicant's qualifications and research abilities;
- Two page statement outlining your research proposal using the template provided with the application form;
- Provision of written support from your proposed primary supervisor;
- Incomplete applications will not be forwarded to the selection panel.

CRITERIA

- The scholarship is open to applicants who are qualified to register for full-time study in a doctoral degree at AUT.
- Applicants must meet the normal admission criteria to the doctoral programme, including second class (first division) honours or equivalent as stated in the Academic Calendar (<http://www.aut.ac.nz/calendar>).

- The proposed field of study is one where the University can offer supervision.
- Preference will be given to new applicants to a doctoral programme.
- The scholarships are awarded on the basis of academic excellence.

SELECTION

- The Scholarships Office will forward to faculties the applications from students who have applied from that faculty. The faculties will then nominate a shortlist from their applications and forward these to the Scholarships Office, who will then organise the final selection meeting.
- Recipients will be selected from the faculty nominations by a sub-committee of the AUT Scholarships and Awards Committee.
- The scholarship is awarded by the Vice Chancellor,
- Selection will be based on demonstrated excellence in the following:
 - » the applicant's academic record (including prizes, awards and any publications),
 - » the applicant's research proposal and background,
 - » the referees' statements,
 and any other relevant information that may be available, including that which meets the University's strategic needs.
- Preference will be given to applicants whose research area aligns with the University's strategy.
- Should a successful applicant decline the award, and there is another suitable applicant, then the scholarship will be offered to that applicant.
- No scholarship will be awarded upon any occasion if the selection panel is of the opinion that there is no applicant of sufficient merit applying for the award.

VICE-CHANCELLOR'S DOCTORAL SCHOLARSHIPS (CONTINUED)

CONDITIONS OF ACCEPTANCE

- The stipend will be paid monthly into a nominated account.
- This scholarship may not be held concurrently with any other bursary or scholarship, without the express approval of the AUT Scholarships and Awards Committee
- The scholarship may be taken up from 1 January until the end of the first semester
- Doctoral registration must be complete before the scholarship can be taken up
- The University Postgraduate Centre will provide the Scholarships Office with an annual report on the scholar's progress and a final report on completion of the programme
 - › Unsatisfactory reports will be forwarded to the Scholarships and Awards Committee for consideration
- Every scholar will be required to devote the whole time during the tenure of the scholarship to the programme of research and may not undertake a level of employment that would interfere with their research
- The AUT Scholarships and Awards Committee may at any time suspend or terminate any stipend, if it determines that the scholar is not diligently pursuing the programme of advanced study or has failed to comply with any of the terms and conditions on which the scholarship was awarded
 - › In such circumstances the scholarship will be terminated and no further payments will be made. This will also apply if a scholar ceases to pursue the programme of research
 - › In cases of suspension the AUT Scholarships and Awards Committee may impose conditions upon the scholar which must be satisfied before the resumption of the stipend.

COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP SCHOLARSHIPS

CLOSING DATE: 4 SEPTEMBER 2009

The purpose of the AUT Community Partnership Scholarships is to increase participation, retention and success of Māori, Pasifika and Disabled people who have demonstrated the academic potential to succeed at tertiary level.

CRITERIA

- All applicants for these scholarships must be:
 - › NZ citizens or permanent residents
 - › Nominated by selected AUT Community Partner School, Private Training Establishment (PTEs) or Partner Organisation on the basis of the potential to successfully complete an undergraduate degree and a track record of success (academic, sporting, cultural or leadership).
 - › Recipients enrolling in undergraduate studies may not be currently enrolled at AUT, or have previously received a School and Community Partner Scholarship.

AMOUNT OF AWARD

- This scholarship covers tuition, student services and Students' Association fees only, for a maximum of four papers per semester.
- Summer school papers are not covered by this scholarship.

TENURE

- This scholarship is awarded, subject to the student annually meeting the conditions of renewal, for a maximum of three years. This may be extended in limited circumstances on a negotiated individual basis
- Disabled students are able to negotiate part-time study options on an individual basis. The maximum timeframe for completion of part-time study is five years.

CONDITIONS OF ACCEPTANCE AND RENEWAL

- The award of these scholarships is conditional on the student gaining entry to an AUT programme
- Students must be enrolled in a full-time programme of study. Part-time study may be negotiated on an individual basis
- This scholarship may not be held in conjunction with any other fees scholarship. The recipient may hold additional non-tuition fee based scholarships with the approval of the Scholarships Office
- Recipients will be required to negotiate a regular contact with their designated AUT Student Services support centre staff. This is an integral part of the first year and may be extended for subsequent years
- Annual renewal of the scholarship is conditional upon the student passing at least half the points of the papers that they have enrolled (achieving at least 3 C grades) and meeting the requirement listed below
 - › Where the student does not meet these conditions they must apply to the Scholarships Office for continuation of enrolment and scholarship
- The Scholarships Office has the power to terminate or suspend a scholarship if it receives an unsatisfactory report on the progress of a recipient from the Student Services support staff or the Programme Leader of the programme in which they are enrolled
- Scholarships may be deferred in some exceptional circumstances. For more information contact the Scholarships Office.

RECIPIENTS ARE REQUIRED TO:

- Attend an official welcome ceremony.

KEIR TRUST STUDY AWARD

CLOSING DATE: 15 SEPTEMBER 2009

The purpose of the Keir Trust Study Award is to encourage students facing financial barriers to undertake studies at AUT by offering financial assistance and ongoing non-financial support, and to actively encourage recipients to act as role models for other young people in their school/community. Particular consideration will be given to applicants wishing to study in engineering or any trade or technician level programmes.

AMOUNT AND TYPE OF AWARD

- The number of new awards will be determined annually
- The value of each award will be for an amount up to \$12,000 over four years. Assistance in years two, three and four may be less than that given in year one.

TENURE

- The tenure of this award is for a maximum of four years. The award may be renewed in years two, three and four, subject to satisfactory performance and continued eligibility for a student allowance.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- Keir Trust Application Form
- Keir Trust Budget Worksheet
- Written recommendation from a school principal and/or an independent referee. Recommendations should indicate:
 - › Why the applicant would have no realistic opportunity of university study without this study award because of the financial barriers
 - › How the applicant's personal attributes match those listed in the Study Award criteria
 - › The applicant's role model potential
 - › Any other relevant information.

CRITERIA

- Applicants must be NZ citizens or permanent residents
- The awards are open to students wishing to study at AUT who can produce clear written evidence to demonstrate major financial difficulties in commencing or continuing their programme of study
- Applicants must have no realistic opportunity of university study without this award
- Applicants are expected to qualify for a student allowance either before or during the year of study (subject to the age limitation) and must have received no other grant covering the costs claimed in the application
- Applicants must demonstrate role model potential
- Applicants should have the desire, determination and ability to succeed
- The award is available for any programme. However, the Trustees wish to encourage entry into engineering or any trade or technician level programmes.

SELECTION

- Applications will be considered by a selection panel from the Keir Trust
- Applicants will be shortlisted by the Trust and those shortlisted will be required to attend an interview
- The decision of the Keir Trust Selection Committee will be final.
- Names of recipients may be forwarded, for information purposes, to the principal of the recipient's school where appropriate
- Presentation of the award may be made to recipients at an appropriate occasion.

CONDITIONS OF ACCEPTANCE

- Recipients must be accepted into the programme of study selected and later satisfactorily complete all enrolment requirements
- Recipients must be prepared to report back to school/community/Keir Trustees, where applicable, on a regular basis (at least annually during course duration)
- Recipients must be prepared to have AUT Student Financial Services act as their mentor
- Recipients must remain eligible for the student allowance throughout the tenure of this award
- Rural study award recipients may be required to reside in a hall of residence designated by AUT during their first year of study
- This award may not be held concurrently with any other bursary or scholarship, without the express approval of the Trustees.

MCDONALD'S (AL DUNN) SCHOLARSHIP

CLOSING DATE: 6 AUGUST 2010

These scholarships are offered to Māori who attend secondary or area schools in the Northland district for the purposes of providing opportunity for study at AUT.

AMOUNT AND TYPE OF AWARD

- Four scholarships are offered per year.
- The scholarship is for a total amount of \$10,000 for a three year programme. \$5,000 is paid in the first year towards AUT Halls of Residence fees and \$2,500 is paid for each of the following years as living costs.

TENURE

- The tenure is for three years.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- McDonald's (Al Dunn) Scholarship Application Form
- Academic Transcript
- Principal's nomination.

CRITERIA

- Applicants must:
 - › be NZ citizens or permanent residents
 - › be Māori school leavers (year 12 or 13) from the Northland district (including Whangarei)
 - › have exceptional leadership potential
 - › have good academic records
 - › face financial hardship
 - › be close to their community and culture
 - › have been nominated by their School Principal
- The successful recipient must have:
 - › a proven commitment to Māori culture
 - › be involved in leadership activities
 - › meet the programme entry requirements
 - › require financial support
 - › apply for and be accepted on a course approved by the selection panel.

SELECTION

- Applicants will be considered and interviewed at their school by staff from Māori Liaison Services and McDonald's New Zealand.
- Māori Liaison Services is responsible for the enrolment of recipients of the scholarships into the University.
- No scholarship will be awarded upon any occasion if the Committee is of the opinion that there is no applicant of sufficient merit applying for the award.

MOST VALUABLE PERSON (MVP) SCHOLARSHIPS

CLOSING DATE: 27 NOVEMBER 2009

The purpose of the AUT MVP Scholarships are to reward leadership, excellence and commitment to sport in all areas and encourage and support students to pursue tertiary education.

CRITERIA

- All applicants for these scholarships must be:
 - › NZ citizens or permanent residents
 - › Nominated by selected AUT Preferential Sports Partners on the basis of:
 - › Consistent high achievement in your chosen sport
 - › Potential to successfully complete an undergraduate degree and a track record of success (academic, sporting, cultural or leadership).
 - › Recipients enrolling in undergraduate studies may not be currently enrolled at AUT, or have previously received a School and Community Partner Scholarship.

AMOUNT OF AWARD

- This scholarship covers tuition and student services fees only, for a maximum of four papers per semester. All other fees, including Students' Association fee will need to be met by the student.
- Summer school papers are not covered by this scholarship.

TENURE

- This scholarship is awarded, subject to the student annually meeting the conditions of renewal, for a maximum of three years. This may be extended in limited circumstances on a negotiated individual basis.
