Take your passion for education further with AUT's Master of Education (MEd). The Master of Education is a 1½-year programme (part-time options available) designed to help professionals in the education sector engage with advanced knowledge, critical analysis, and research skills.

Specialisations

EDUCATIONAL LEADERSHIP

The Educational Leadership specialisation suits leaders or aspiring leaders in the early childhood, schools, and tertiary sectors as well as other educational settings. This specialisation will help advance your knowledge and practical skills to develop your leadership and help you create a positive impact on the future of education.

HIGHER EDUCATION

This specialisation is ideal for experienced tertiary teachers who want to critique and enhance their professional learning and practice. You'll examine and inquire into your own practice as a higher education teacher and critique and redesign curriculum and assessment practices. Courses also consider broader topics including global impacts on higher education, and leadership and collegial practice.

GENERAL (NO SPECIALISATION)

A non-specialist general master's programme enables you to take an array of courses that include developing a core understanding of educational studies, digital pedagogies, innovations in education and Māori and Pacific education.

Programme pathways

The Master of Education has three pathways:

- Coursework only
- Coursework + 60-point dissertation
- Coursework + 90-point thesis

COURSEWORK PATHWAY

The coursework pathway consists of four 30-point courses at level 8 and two 30-point courses at level 9. This can be applied to a specialist or general curriculum.

DISSERTATION OR THESIS PATHWAY

Your dissertation or thesis is an advanced study based on independent research, aimed at contributing new knowledge to a relevant educational issue. This pathway includes doing a mixture of coursework and ending the programme with either a 90-point thesis, or, with Programme Leader approval, a 60-point dissertation.

Applicants must have completed a relevant bachelor's degree or equivalent with a B grade average (or higher). Applicants for the Education Leadership or Higher Education specialisation must have at least two years of relevant professional experience or approval of the programme leader.
