

## Te Reo proficiency test process

Studied te reo before and unsure what level you should start with?

It is important to note while previous qualifications are acknowledged, all students must complete a proficiency test if you wish to enrol into courses with prerequisites (a compulsory paper that must be completed prior to enrolling). You can see the prerequisite requirements in the table below.

Our te reo papers are intended to be completed in the below order (part-time basis only).

Course Code	Course Title	Prerequisite	Expected te reo level when enrolling
MAOR505	Te Mānūtanga Beginners Māori Language 1	Nil	This course focuses on listening, speaking, reading, written and grammar skills in the Māori language at a beginner's level.
MAOR506	Te Ekenga Waka Beginners Māori Language 2	MAOR505	This course extends on the listening, speaking, reading, written and grammar skills covered in MAOR505.
MAOR601	Ki te Hoe Intermediate Māori Language 1	MAOR506	Classes are taught in 50-75% te reo. Students should be relatively confident speakers and writers (although not yet fluent) and most likely studied prior or raised with te reo māori.
MAOR602	Tōkihi hī Intermediate Māori Language 2	MAOR601	
MAOR701	Tere ki Tai Advanced Māori Language 1	MAOR602	Full emersion te reo class. Students should be fluent in te reo māori and confident in written and spoken reo.
MAOR702	Tere ki Uta Advanced Māori Language 2	MAOR701	

Students are required to complete an online test without using any supporting resources so our kaiako can get an accurate understanding of a student's current level of te reo. The kaiako may follow up for a short kōrero. The kaiako will recommend the most suitable course for students to enrol into.
