Everyone knows that!

We all act and interact and we all know just how we do the things we do. Or do we? This lecture takes us through the journey of how a new theory of human action and interaction was developed. From the first moments of the

realisation that no framework existed to analyse the data that Sigrid had collected in anthropological linguistic fashion over a year of ethnographic fieldwork to the trepidation of being told to write a book about the newly developed framework; from a frantic testing of the analytical tools created to the next realisation that this was only the very beginning. Yet a new theory is not built in a vacuum and in her inaugural professorial address, Professor Sigrid Norris will show how particular people were critical for the development of this multimodal framework.

Sigrid is Professor of Multimodal (Inter) action and Director of the Multimodal Research Centre at Auckland University of Technology in New Zealand. She is the author of Analyzing Multimodal Interaction (Routledge 2004), Identity in (Inter)action (de Gruyter 2011), and forthcoming Systematically Working with Multimodal Data (Wiley Feb. 2019). Sigrid is editor of Multimodality in Practice (Routledge 2012), Multimodality: Critical Concepts in Linguistics (4 Volumes, Routledge 2015), co-editor of Discourse in Action (Routledge 2005) and Interactions, Texts and Images (de Gruyter 2014). She is founding editor of the International Journal Multimodal Communication (de Gruyter) and has published the two poetry books rosarot und schwarz (deutscher lyrik verlag 2008) and Liebe und Trennung/Love and Separation (mykum 2016).
