CHANGES TO PROGRAMMES & MAJORS

- Bachelor of Sport and Recreation has been refreshed and is now called the Bachelor of Sport, Exercise and Health with majors in Health and Physical Education, Sport and Exercise Science, and Sport Leadership and Management. It also now follows our flexible degree structure (more details below)
- The **Chiropractic** pathway in the Diploma of Applied Science is no longer open to new enrolments
- The **Economics** major in the Bachelor of Arts only is no longer open to new enrolments. The Economics major in the Bachelor of Business is still available
- The **Maritime Engineering** major in the Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) no longer includes the option to focus on **Marine and Offshore Engineering**. The Naval Architecture or Ocean Engineering options are still available.

DEGREE BUILDER FOR SOME PROGRAMMES

Some of our bachelor's degrees offer extra flexibility and enable students to include subjects from another area at AUT as part of their degree. Students can complete these programmes in three years full-time, so in a shorter timeframe than conjoint programmes. ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

Students whose first language is not English, Maori or NZ Sign Language need to prove they have the minimum level of English required to enrol in their chosen AUT qualification.

International students studying at secondary schools and applying for UE through NCEA, CAIE or IB must apply using the English requirements of that qualification.

IELTS (Academic) results may also be required for AUT degrees with professional bodies that use IELTS (Academic) as their literacy measure, eg the Bachelor of Health Science (Midwifery, Nursing, Occupational Therapy, Oral Health, Paramedicine, Physiotherapy). IELTS (Academic) is also the preferred English test for all other AUT qualifications. For more details, refer to **aut.ac.nz/englishrequirements**

Initial teacher education programmes require a higher level of English language requirements than similar level programmes, and these requirements are set by the Teaching Council. There are several ways you can meet these requirements, including several test options available. RANK SCORES

AUT programmes with rank scores

The Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) uses a rank score as part of their entry requirement process.

Bachelor of Engineering (Honours)

Guaranteed entry: Applicants will automatically be offered a place in this programme if they have a rank score of 250 or higher, along with 14 NCEA level 3 credits in each of Calculus and Physics or CAIE A levels in Mathematics and Physics. All other applicants who have met the admission requirements will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

Health science degrees

The popular health science degrees give preference to the highest level of academic achievement (highest performing students). While there is no set rank score for guaranteed entry, where a qualification is over-subscribed, rank scores may be considered as one of the factors in assessing applications.

How we calculate the rank score

NCEA

- 80 best level 3 NCEA credits in University Entrance approved subjects are weighted by level of achievement
- No more than 24 credits per subject will be counted
- If a student achieves fewer than 80 credits at level 3 or higher, the score will be calculated on achieved credits

Excellence: 4 points Merit: 3 points Achieved: 2 points

Note: Excellence and Merit credits are counted first, followed by the required number of Achieved, up to the maximum total of 80 credits.

Cambridge Assessment International Examinations (CAIE)

- Based on the student's UCAS Tariff score
- No more than six subject units over the last two years of study will be counted in subjects at AS, A2 or A level from subjects that match the NCEA University Entrance approved subjects
- The rank score may differ from the UCAS Tariff used for University Entrance because only subjects equivalent to NCEA approved subjects will be used for calculating
- An A level counts as two subject units and an AS level counts as one subject unit. Students who have studied more than six subject units can count only the six best scores

International Baccalaureate (IB)

- The student must have achieved the IB Diploma (24 points)
- We will evaluate students on the number of points achieved above 24
