

Postgraduate Certificate in Visual Arts Information for Applicants

Thank you for your interest in the Postgraduate Certificate in Visual Arts programme (Code: AK1330).

Intake: There is one intake each year in February

Programme structure

The Postgraduate Certificate in Visual Arts is a one-semester (12 week) programme of taught study, if enrolled full time. Part time options are available. The elective papers are 6 weeks in duration while Te Ao Mahora: Creative Practice Research Design and Contextual Review are 12 weeks.

Students enrolled in this programme are required to complete 60 points of course work. On completion of the PGCertVisArts with a B grade average or higher you can apply to continue in the Master of Visual Arts research year.

Purpose of the Project Statement of Intent:

The purpose of the *Project Statement of Intent* is to support you (the student) to assist us (the postgraduate selection panel) in understanding the scope, direction, and conceptual focus of your proposed research project. It should situate your topic in a clearly defined territory of inquiry. For example, the area you are interested in may be discipline-specific (drawing, printmaking, painting, sculpture, installation, photography, performance, film and video, mixed media, sound, interactive, participation, social practice, etc.), or focused on an interdisciplinary approach.

Documents to support your application

All applicants must provide <u>each</u> of the following documents to support their application:

- 1. Certified copies of the academic transcript/results and completion certificates of your qualifications.
- 2. A current CV briefly outlining any previous experience relevant to your application for postgraduate study.
- 3. A Project Statement of Intent and A Portfolio of work a selection of 10 to 12 images of recent work supporting your proposal. Please supply these as a PDF, PowerPoint file or a website link. Please include an index for images and a brief commentary about the context within which the work was produced.

You will be contacted if you are required to attend an interview in person or online.
