Standard presentations are 20 minutes, including questions. There is also limited time for Chair's introductions, and to allow people to move between sessions. Please respect your fellow presenters and audience by keeping to your allotted time. This ensures all presenters have a chance to speak equally and audience questions and comments are heard.

It is recommended to prepare your presentation as a full written paper. This will help you hone and develop your argument, thoughts and presentation to ensure you are meeting the expected outcomes of the conference themes. Prepare any PowerPoint or similar presentation files in advance (back-up your electronic files to avoid any risks)

Generally, it takes 2 minutes to read a double-spaced page at reasonable speed, therefore 13 minutes speaking time is 6-7 pages double spaced. Practice delivering your paper in a conversational tone and time yourself, remembering that you may add start and end remarks during the session. At conference, make contact with your session Chair. Check they have been provided with your presentation. Arrive at least 5 minutes prior to your session.
