AUT is ranked in the top 1% of universities worldwide as assessed by both QS World University Rankings and Times Higher Education.

We are recognised by Times Higher Education as the top university in Australasia for global research impact, and ranked first in New Zealand for international outlook.

Many of our subject areas are world-ranked and we are rated a five-star university by QS.

The AUT Business School is accredited by AACSB and EQUIS, which ranks it in the top 5% in the world.
