


Bachelor of Arts(BA) in Psychology

1. A student who is granted admission to the programme on the basis of having already completed the Bachelor of Health Science (Honours) with a B grade average or higher must achieve 120 points by successfully completing the thesis.

- 2. Where a student has transferred into the Master of Health Science and is required to complete 120 points, the time limit to complete shall be a minimum of one year and a maximum of three years.
- 3. After completing the Bachelor of Health Science (Honours) degree (120 points), students can apply for the Master of Health Science in Psychology. The MHSc in Psychology is 240 points and consists of 120 points Advanced Standing from BHSc (Hons) and a further 120 points for completion.
- 4. If your focus is counselling psychology then we recommend you select the following course(s) within the Master of Health Science in Psychology specialisation: PSYC809, PSYC810, PSYC811 and PSYC997.
