

AUT International Scholarships – Faculty of Culture and Society

CLOSING DATE: 15 May (Semester Two intake)

PURPOSE

Auckland University of Technology (AUT) and the Faculty of Culture and Society provide scholarships to recognise and support international students as they begin their journey in becoming great graduates of AUT.

AMOUNT AND TYPE OF AWARD

The scholarship consists of a \$7,000 contribution towards fees.

TENURE

• The scholarship is awarded for one year only.

NUMBER ON OFFER

• 20

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- Applicants must be full fee-paying international students (Note: International students are students who are neither citizens, permanent residents nor resident visa holders of New Zealand or Australia).
- New to AUT applicants must have a current and valid conditional or unconditional offer to study in a Faculty of Culture and Society programme (Bachelor's degree only and at least 120 points) commencing in Semester 2 2023.
- Students who have already commenced studies at AUT are not eligible to apply.
- Applicants are required to declare if they have applied for other forms of scholarships both internally (i.e., awarded by AUT) and externally (e.g., government scholarships). The selection committee will take this into consideration.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must complete the AUT International Scholarships - Faculty of Culture and Society application online through the AUT Scholarships on the AUT website: www.aut.ac.nz/scholarships.

SELECTION PROCESS

- Applications will be shortlisted and selected by the selection committee comprising of Dean (or nominee), representative of Faculty of Culture and Society and AUT International.
- Applicants who have declared other forms of scholarships both internally (i.e., awarded by AUT) and externally (e.g., government scholarships) will be considered on a case-bycase basis regarding eligibility.
- The country of origin of the applicant may be considered by the selection committee to align with AUT's strategic aims.

CONDITIONS OF ACCEPTANCE AND APPOINTMENT

- The award of this scholarship is conditional on the student gaining entry to an AUT programme.
- The scholarship will be paid as a compulsory fees credit towards the first year of study at AUT, based on enrolment and payment of tuition in at least 120 points.
- Recipients of this scholarship are required to be enrolled full time at AUT during the tenure of the scholarship. Failure to do so may result in the recipient being required to pay back the full value of the scholarship received.
- The recipient may hold other non-AUT scholarships with the approval of the Scholarships Office.
- Scholarship may be terminated if recipients are found to have not truthfully declared their details during the application process.
- Recipients who do not maintain satisfactory academic standing (by passing all courses) or conduct during the tenure of the scholarship may be required to pay back the full value of the scholarship received.
- By accepting the award, scholarship recipients agree to participate in publicity requests from AUT to represent the university and the scholarship.
- The scholarship cannot be deferred.
- The scholarship cannot be held concurrently with New Zealand AUT-NCUK Scholarship and Other AUT International Scholarships.
- The scholarship cannot be held by students whose studies are being fully sponsored by either a home government or the NZ government.
- Except in cases where there are compelling medical reasons or adverse personal circumstance beyond a student's control, the uptake of the scholarship cannot be deferred.
- The regulations are reviewed by the Scholarships Committee from time to time and are subject to change.
