A graduate of the **Bachelor of Arts** will be able to:

- a. Demonstrate knowledge of the major concepts and theoretical perspectives in their chosen field of study. (*Knowledge/Understanding*)
- b. Integrate their knowledge and skills to respond to unfamiliar or new contexts or situations. (*Knowledge/Understanding*)
- c. Appreciate or draw on interdisciplinary or multi-disciplinary knowledge in their field of enquiry. (*Knowledge/Understanding*)
- d. Work autonomously and take responsibility for their own learning and development. (*Personal and Intellectual Autonomy*)
- e. Consider the broader social and cultural implications and issues in their chosen field of study and area of professional practice. (Ethical and Professional Dispositions)
- f. Demonstrate an awareness of the ethical responsibilities and challenges in their community of practice. (*Ethical and Professional Dispositions*)
