


## 'Anxiety'






# "Descend"

Process – I used photoshop to draw the images and then went on to use lithography to print the images on to my textured ink backgrounds.

Process – I took close up photographs of myself pressed up against windows and with tape on my face to create an unusual and uncomfortable feeling. I then used these images and etched them to create this series.



### "Breakdown"

### <u>June 2016</u>

Process – I drew a distorted image of my face and used the process of copper sulfate to slowly erode and break my plate to appear as if I was breaking and disintegrating. I used sand paper on plexi plate to create a subtle scratched background.



#### "Overwhelmed"

#### September 2016

Process – I took photos of my face showing different, anxious expressions and then drew and used lithography to print them onto textured, collograph face shaped backgrounds. I also used the process of copper sulfate to add some ghostly and distorted face shapes/texture and etched the girl (me) sitting at the bottom.

## **Design Technology**

Another form of design I take interest in is product design. At school I take Design Technology and have had the opportunity to design many conceptual and practical products including a kitchen utensil for people suffering from Arthritis, a wooden stool (right) and a concrete planter box and wooden frame (left).
