

You'll work in virtual production studios with Hollywood-grade tech, including photographic and lighting facilities, a virtual production studio, and motion capture labs, and create in printmaking labs that professional artists use. 
WORLD-LEADING RESEARCH





Every student at AUT needs to meet minimum entry requirements. Some programmes are competitive, so you may need more than that. You'll find full details at aut.ac.nz – here's a quick guide to help you plan your next step.

University admission to AUT bachelor's degrees

If you're a New Zealand citizen, resident or an international student at a New Zealand high school, you'll need University Entrance. Some programmes also ask for specific subjects or interviews – it's all about making sure you're ready to succeed.

Admission categories

You can enter under one of these:

- NCEA University Entrance
 - Ad Eundem Statum admission (same level) – this includes Cambridge Assessment International Education (CAIE) and International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IB)
 - Discretionary Entrance
 - Special Admission

Certificates and diplomas

Requirements vary by programme. You can find details for your chosen programme on our website aut.ac.nz

Graduate certificates and graduate diplomas
