

MASTER OF EDUCATION

A graduate of the **Master of Education** will be able to:

- a. Demonstrate advanced knowledge and understanding of education, including methodological and theoretical concepts from a range of education-related fields and epistemologies (*Knowledge/Understanding*)
- Critically evaluate research-based and theoretical knowledge pertaining to the field of education through independent scholarship and research (*Personal and Intellectual Autonomy*)
- c. Engage in ongoing self-analysis of learning and practice to construct strategies to continue self and professional development (Personal and Intellectual Autonomy)
- d. Act with integrity and reflexivity in research and its application in educational and cultural contexts, especially through understanding and enacting obligations of Te Tiriti o Waitangi and mātauranga Māori (Ethical and Professional Dispositions)
- e. Creatively apply knowledge of education and research to problematising, understanding or addressing problems of educational policy and practice (Inquiry, Research and Creativity)
- f. Critically use and generate research evidence within their professional environment, including evidence from the conceptualisation, design, and realisation of their own educational research projects (Application/Skills)
- g. Clearly communicate their understanding of education and educational research to others through multiple means, both simple and complex (Communication)
